10 QUESTIONS TO ASK EACH OTHER BEFORE PLANNING YOUR WEDDING



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She was afraid to ask anything of her husband for fear of arguing. She thought that a baby would force them to talk. The baby didn't—a baby doesn't have that kind of power.

The philosopher Nietzsche claimed that in its essence, marriage is *one long, grand conversation*.

If marriage is a conversation, do you and your partner enjoy talking with each other? What do you talk about?

When I meet with couples as they create their wedding ceremony, I give them this list of questions—some of which they've never asked of each other. Perhaps a few of these will spark a new conversation between you and your partner.

- 1. Who are your role models for marriage? Why are they models? How realistic a model are they?
- 2. What three words do you want people to use when they describe your wedding? What three words do you not want them to say?
- 3. Is your wedding day a *beginning* or a *touch point* in your life together?
- 4. What was the most moving, most joyful wedding you've attended? What do you want to be the most joyful moment of your wedding?
- 5. Is your partner your life or does your partner give you life?
- 6. What makes your partner worthy of your love? What makes you worthy of your partner's love?
- 7. What are your expectations for each other? Do your expectations make each of you the best person you're capable of being?
- 8. What is your biggest fear for your life together?
- 9. What is your definition of *success*? As an individual? As a couple?
- 10. On your 25th wedding anniversary, what would you like your life to look like?

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
